## Hotel Hope opening 01 December 2008

The first 'Hotel' will open its doors in Melville, a trendy, multicultural and multi-racial part of Johannesburg, South Africa on 01 December 2008, World-Aids-Day.

The philosophy of Hotel Hope is to cre-

ate family style homes, complete with God-parents and Aunties, Uncles and Grannies who will love and role-model values to the children in our care.

The founders of Hotel Hope believe that the times of institutions, where children are clothed and fed but not loved, cherished and encouraged are over and that the time has come for small homes, where children can grow up as part of a family to become successful players in their respective communities.

## Charity Shop to open soon

We are very excited about our dedicated Charity shop that we are intending to open in 2nd Avenue Melville on the corner of Main Str. The purpose of this shop is two-fold. One, to provide an income for Hotel Hope through the sale of donations,

clothes, books, furniture and bric-a-brac etc. The second purpose is to create employment for a shop manager and two assistants to run the shop. Employment in SA is so important to the current situation this country finds itself in.

We want to create homes where LOVE flows in abundance and where excellence is experienced on all levels: Spiritually, Physically, Mentally, Emotionally, Educationally and Financially.

We work with an adoption agency who will find 'forever' families for those children that can be adopted and we will love those long term who cannot be fostered or adopted.

We haven't opened our home yet, we are not yet fully registered as a Non-Profit-Organisation, but that does not affect the generosity of friends of the organisation, churches and corporates. We have already received 4 cots, brand-new bedding, car-seats, towels & bed linen, very gently worn toddler clothes, baby blankets and much more. Praise be to God for His faithfulness in supplying our every need.

Anyone familiar with the energy crisis in South Africa will understand how important and even life-saving such a generator can be. We are faced with power cuts often lasting many hours and this genera-

tor will help us to keep infant formula at the right temperature and also keep up oxygen supply to children with respiratory illnesses, often caused by HIV. More praise be to Him.

## Poverty in South Africa

Poverty, even more than HIV & AIDS is the foremost reason for the high numbers of abandonment in South Africa. Current estimates state 1500 illegal immigrants arrive in South Africa daily from neighbouring Zimbabwe alone, to escape even bigger poverty. They immediately head for the big city in the hope of employment. On their own, living in informal shacks or on the street, without any support network, mothers have nearly no chance of raising a child.



## A Baptism Pool



The home has a small outdoor pool. The initial plan was to transform it into a large sand pit even so the positive effects of swimming and water activities on small children are well documented.

The decision for it to remain a pool and not a sand pit was made when 2 visiting pastors from Churches in Johannesburg asked whether we would allow them to perform full immersion baptisms in the pool. Our founder Oliver Quambusch was so inspired by the idea that he suggested he might become one of the

first people to be baptised... Can you imagine growing up witnessing the power of the Holy Spirit at work in different people's lives in your own backyard? We believe that this experience will be priceless for the children in our care.

## HIV & Orphan statistics in South Africa



UNAIDS/WHO in July 2008 published an estimate of 18.1% HIV prevalence in those aged 15-49 years old at the end of 2007. This implies that around 5.7 million South Africans were living with HIV at the end of 2007, including 280,000 children under 15 years old.

By 2010, it is estimated that orphans will constitute between 9 and 12% of the SA population and there will be a vast increase in child-headed families. 61% of South Africa's children live in poverty and 1.6 million children of school-going age are out of school. The HIV/ AIDS pandemic is changing communities and has a major impact on the

nature of families. When parents die of AIDS, it is normally the grandparents who are left to care for the orphaned children. Very often these grandparents are surviving on state pensions, which are barely enough to sustain themselves, let alone the addition of one or more young children. Where there are no grandparents, families are often headed by the older surviving child, who have no access to resources or skills to raise their young siblings.

These scenarios often result in affected children facing malnourishment, stunting, abuse, exploitation and loss of inheri-

tance. They also face social stigma, discrimination and a feeling of abandonment. On account of reduced household incomes, children can often no longer attend school, which impedes their social and intellectual development. This may in turn cause them to turn to crime or prostitution as a means of survival.
